The new school term began on base in early January. Rick had his first opportunity to present a three day *Foundations for Farming* course to the Missions students who were both eager and attentive.

Karin was also able to share one of her favourite topics, *Hearing God's Voice* with new discipleship students.

Rick's Ruminations

Life here has been an adventure. For me, it is great to see how the first attempt to grow maize in Zambia is doing. It is ripening now and in about 6 weeks will be dry and ready to harvest. It is not as tall as the maize in Malawi but then again it is a small field (10m x 10m) and we did not put in any top dressing.



I finished my first teaching session with 12 missionary students. Next I may have the opportunity to train an entire association of mango farmers in April/May.

The biggest challenge is how quickly the garden area grows weeds and I have few tools and little help. I have some student help sporadically for an hour once or twice a week, but for things to work well, this has to change.

My main objective is teaching others to use the Foundations for Farming method which was designed for subsistence farmers, teaching them Godly principles, starting with what they have and expanding to cover their plot as they prosper.

My mandate is to train mission students, conventional farmers, churches and school teachers (who will then train the children.)

I look forward to sharing more about my "model farm" vision when I am in Canada this summer.

Freedom is Coming



Karin spent the last two weeks of January in Pretoria editing a book about five years of The Freedom Climb. She was stirred by the struggles of women who are trafficked, abused and marginalized and the stories of those who have climbed mountains to raise both awareness and much needed funding for supportive projects.

She returned to Zambia in time to lead an all night prayer meeting during the hours that 17 people were summiting Mt. Kilimanjaro. The theme of the night was *If they can climb,* we can pray. From 7 PM until 5:30 the next morning between 19 and 25 people prayed them to the top!
