# PASTOR REPORT

#### The Year God Rescued Me (again and again)

(Dauphin – year 13 – Sept to Sept)

When I look back at that year – the word "whirlwind" comes to mind. It was my seventh and final year on our denominational board – which found itself in the middle of one of those messes that takes time and energy and complete reliance on God. Dauphin First Baptist was celebrated and thanked publicly at Assembly for their generosity – having given their pastor to serve in such a heavy capacity. The adventure ended abruptly as I placed the gavel into the next guy's capable hands. Lots of work goes on behind the scenes to help our churches serve God together. I am forever changed.

In Dauphin, so many happy times. We turned 125 with some cake and a beautiful day. We baptized Kanon. We built a float. (You might not have heard we won first place ... in the religious category) Christmas eve and all the fixings – the songs and candlelight – with Jesus at the centre. We shared Good Friday with the new Alliance folks and delighted in sharing our mission stories. All through that we had our new Community Liaison and her helpers busily organizing the meals for those using the Food Bank – we started Kid's Church and hosted the Words of Encouragement Youth Bible Study. Griefshare and MOPS – Leadership retreats – Team meetings – The Chosen study – shared meals and shared snacks – we met our neighbours almost every Thursday – and sang at the PCH – Norm and Gwyneth faithfully represented us there too.

It does sound full when I list it in such a scattered list. I should mention not all was happy.
